

Godly Play Training

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Are you looking to attend Godly Play training in Ireland this year, or do you know anyone who might be interested? There's a Core Training course happening in Thurles in July.

Develop your confidence in and understanding of the art of Godly Play through watching, doing and reflecting on experience together.

Each day unpacks one of the primary genres of Godly Play: Sacred Stories Parables and Liturgical Lessons. Workshops also cover setting up a Godly Play space and the theology and spirituality of childhood and there is time to explore your questions and concerns.

How can Godly Play be used?

Godly Play is a gentle way for children to engage with the Bible and Christianity and to explore its meaning for their lives. It creates the space and tells the stories in such a way that children can listen deeply, wonder and respond. Godly Play storytelling combines words with careful movement of story materials and leads into open-ended exploration and creative response.

Godly Play can be used in schools, parishes, hospitals and at home. It is used in play and prayer groups, holiday and afterschool clubs, school retreats, as part of religious education programmes, for family worship and for sacramental preparation. It can be adapted for use in children's liturgies.

Although it has been developed for children, it works well with adults too, and is used in retreats and in care homes.

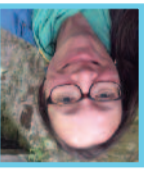

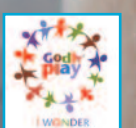
